

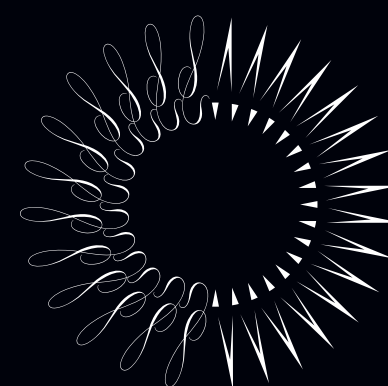

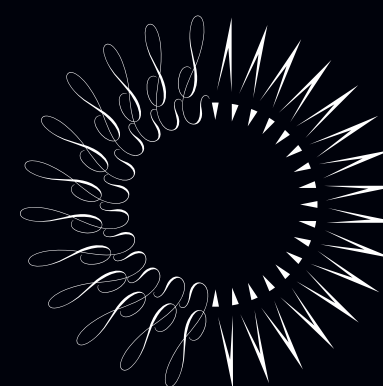


# It's not chicken feed.

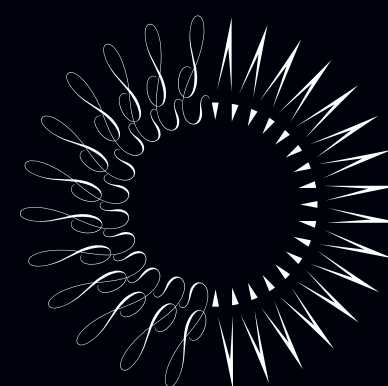


# Human antibiotics are fed routinely to livestock.

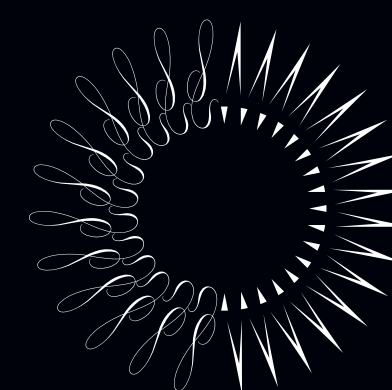
